It is really lovely to see some beautiful spring days as we come to the closure of Term 3, 2023.

Our school grounds are looking beautiful and we are waiting in anticipation for our student cubby houses that are being built by St Monica's students.

2024 News

We are pleased to announce that we have employed two new teachers that will be part of our 2024 teaching team:

Marcus Stella and Laura Irons will join our dynamic teaching team next year.

Marcus and Laura will be part of our 2024 planning days and our Berry Street Professional Learning days.

We are also excited that our literacy / numeracy intervention and extension programs will continue in 2024. This will ensure we continue to stretch and challenge our students in their learning.

Our classroom formations will change in 2024 and we will have three Year 3 learning spaces and two Year 4 learning spaces. We will continue with two Year Preps, two Year 1, two Year 2 and four Year 5/6 learning spaces.

Road works around our school

We continue to communicate with the Whittlesea Council regarding the road works around our school. It is anticipated that the Coulstock Street works will be completed in the next two weeks. We understand that Wedge Street works will commence shortly after this completion.

Claire Toner, our office manager is communicating with the council and trying to determine parking and entry and exit arrangements during the Wedge Street road works.

Student safety is always our paramount concern. The installation of car stoppers is a result of our petitioning for safety in this space. We highlighted the safety concerns in this space if a car was to accidentally accelerate instead of reversing.



We encourage our families to contact the Whittlesea Council if you identify safety concerns around our school. Working together we can ensure the safety of our St Peter's community.

Time in Lieu -School Closure: Monday 6th November 2023

On Monday 26th June 2023 the following correspondence was sent to families via Operoo and was included in the Newsletter in Week 1 Term 3 2023

A new enterprise agreement covering teachers across most of the Catholic schools in Victoria, including ours, has been approved and is in effect.

The new agreement delivers several positive changes for both our dedicated staff and the overall functioning of our school, including improved pay and employment conditions. One key aspect of this agreement is the inclusion of new **time-in-lieu** provisions, which will enable our teachers and support staff to accumulate additional time off when they are required to work more than their regular 38 hours per week which might include overnight camps and supervision at evening and weekend activities.

This change is a recognition of the considerable extra work our teachers are asked to do and will enhance their work-life balance and well-being. **Monday 6th November is an allocated time in lieu day for St Peter's staff.**

We sincerely appreciate your understanding and support in this matter. By prioritising the well-being and work-life balance of our dedicated staff, we are fostering an environment that promotes excellence in teaching and learning.

News from the Maths Hub

The Year of the Mathematician

This year, our school has been on an exciting journey as we refine our teaching practices in mathematics to improve students' engagement and achievement in Numeracy.

Our teachers have been exploring and trialling effective practices in their classrooms to discover the best ways to engage all students in the learning and promote critical thinking and reasoning. We have unpacked the skills required to be a learner in the 21st century and are placing more emphasis on deep thinking, collaboration and problem solving strategies.

We have had a strong focus on giving students structured learning experiences where they can make discoveries and connections in their learning while being guided and challenged by their teachers. The teachers have also embedded routines that encourage students to share their thinking and respond to the thinking of others.

As part of our improvement practices, our teachers have been released from their classrooms to observe great teaching practices across the school. During this time, teachers engage in another class, observing how others create rich and purposeful learning experiences in a mathematics lesson.

It is through this that we are striving to have consistent best teaching practices across the whole school. We are very lucky to have received funding from the Melbourne Archdiocese of Catholic Schools to run this professional learning program at our school.

As we continue along this journey, we are finding our students to be more engaged in mathematics, making real life connections, challenging themselves and becoming greater risk takers in their learning.

Using the Kiss and Drop: Wedge Street



1. Drive to the end of the kiss and drop lane way

This allows maximum amount of cars to be off Wedge Street to avoid traffic and council fines for parking on the road

2. School bags in the cabin of the car.

For safety the children never stand or walk between cars, in case a car accidentally accelerates forward and a child is jammed between cars

- 3. The driver or adult passengers do not get out of the car. Teachers on duty will assist the students. Adults getting out of the car, holds up the traffic flow. If you want to get out of the car: park the car in a side street and walk
- 4. Child only gets out the passenger side. If this is not possible do not use kiss and drop
- 5. **Be patient and do not overtake cars.** Some children need extra assistance with entering and exiting the car
- 6. If you want to assist your child getting out of the car or walking to the gate please park your car and walk to the Wedge Street gates.

Teaching and Learning


Acknowledging Indigenous Literacy Day and Celebrating our Diversity

It's been a very busy Term 3, with lots of parent engagement sharing in the teaching and learning here at St. Peter's.

This week acknowledges Indigenous Literacy Day. We know that foundational reading and writing skills are the first steps for children to build contexts of and understand the world around them. Indigenous Literacy Day aims to make literature and resources accessible to indigenous people in remote areas of our country. It's an opportunity for Australia's first people to shape literacy and make it meaningful and culturally relevant.

St. Peter's believes that diversity is our strength and believes that children of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children, as well as all other children from all other cultures should see their culture and languages in the books that they read. It's important to see themselves in the stories they hear. We are proud of the culturally diverse range of books available from our school library. If there is a book title that you feel would be valuable for us to add to our collection, please let us know.

Continue to read daily with your children and share stories from your culture often.





Term 4 Curriculum Planning Days

As year levels come to the end of their current Science inquiries, teachers are beginning to prepare for new inquiries within the Humanities curriculum for Term 4. Our teaching staff are very excited to engage their students in their new learning content and will spend time in the coming days planning and collaborating with curriculum leaders.



Wellbeing



National Child Protection Week

This week we acknowledged National Child Protection Week. As a school community we are all responsible for the wellbeing and safety of the children in our community. Throughout the week, students in all levels took part in learning activities that were focused on safety and child protection.

Each level revised the Recognise, React and Report process. This process encourages students to recognise things around them and identify if they

are feeling unsafe, to react to the situation in an appropriate way and to report the situation to a truncated adult.



Each class discussed help seeking and personal support networks. Personal support networks consist of trusted adults both inside and outside of the family home that each child can talk to if they need support with a situation that they feel is unsafe.

As part of the learning this week, students in Years 3-6 took part in a webinar hosted by the eSafety Commissioner of Victoria. The session helped the students to identify ways to protect ourselves online and what to do if things go wrong. They learnt about using device settings to protect personal information and identities and developed help seeking and reporting strategies.

Students in Prep to Year 2 will have a visit from officers from the Epping Police station tomorrow. They will talk to the students about how the police help children and other people in the community and how to contact the police if there is an emergency.



St Peter's Helping Hands

To make sure that all of the students at St Peter's are feeling connected, happy and safe we will have some extra helpers outside. Our School Captains and Vice Captains will be St Peter's 'Helping Hands'. Each recess and lunch these children will be wearing an orange vest so they can be seen and their role is to help students in the yard that may need assistance.

Our 'Helping Hands' will support students with making connections and feeling safe. Working with the school leaders the students have said that they can support with the following:

- Help students to find their friends or a new buddy to play with.
- Help to solve a small problem they may have in the yard such as how to ask to join a game.
 - Help students to find a teacher on the yard when needed.
 - Listen to students and have a chat with them.
 - Check in and make sure our school community is feeling ok.

National Day Against Violence and Bullying

As a part of Child Protection Week, we are acknowledging the National Day Against Violence and Bullying. This year's theme is 'Growing Connections'



When someone has many connections to people and places, they feel safe and happy. The more connections they have, the better they are at dealing with hard times in their life. Having people to talk to, or to ask for help, are great ways to help prevent bullying and to feel safe.

Students will engage in some learning about growing connections and are **asked to wear orange**

tomorrow, Friday September 8th as we recognise this day in our school community.



Medical Management

Asthma & Hayfever

The onset of spring and warmer weather brings with it an increase in pollen count. We are seeing an increase of students with asthma and hayfever symptoms. Having good control of hayfever can help to reduce asthma triggers. If your child has allergies such as hay fever and asthma and require medication at school, a personal ASCIA Action Plan needs to be completed in colour, signed by the doctor and a copy provided to the school office. It is recommended that all plans are reviewed on an annual basis. If your child hasn't had their plan reviewed in the past year, now is the time to do this.

The <u>Green Allergy / Allergic Rhinitis Action Plan</u> is to be used for students with allergic rhinitis (hay fever) that may require treatment such as antihistamines.

The Asthma Action Plan for Victorian Schools is to be used for students who have asthma.

Any prescribed medication associated with the plan needs to be supplied to the school in its original packaging. In accordance with our <u>Medical Management Policy</u>, medications such as paracetamol and ibuprofen can only be administered at school with a medical authority form completed by the parent and medical practitioner. Medication is not to be kept with students in their bags. It is preferable that medication is administered at home where possible.

Other Medical Conditions

If your child has a diagnosed medical condition, a **specific condition form** (i.e: Anaphylaxis, Diabetes, Asthma, Epilepsy, Hayfever) or a generic **Medical Management Plan** for all other medical conditions needs to be completed by your child's doctor and provided to the school. This will enable the school to ensure we are meeting our duty of care obligations and to develop a **Student Health Support plan**.

A **Student Health Support Plan** is a document that the School and Parent create and agree upon based on the information provided in the Medical Management Plan. This document details how staff will provide the required support, where medication will be stored, what will happen on excursions etc.

The care, safety and wellbeing of our students is of utmost importance.

St Peter's Primary School has been super fortunate to have had Cricket Victoria run FREE 4 after school specialised skill clinics. Through this, 60 students have had the opportunity to develop their fundamental movement skills in the cricketing sphere, with the attempt to entice students to play cricket with their peers and friends.

Procedure for Reporting an Absence

Thank you to the families that are using the notices@stprepp.catholic.edu.au email account or the 'Report an Absence' link on our website, to notify the school of an absence.


