Principal Report

Good afternoon St Peter's Community, We have certainly started Term 4 with a bang

Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS) Science Technology Engineering and Maths (STEM) Making a Difference Showcase

St. Peter's is very proud of the teaching and learning opportunities that we provide to our students. During the past terms, our Middle and Senior School students have been collaborating in small groups trying to solve real world problems that they have connected with. Part of this STEM learning has been the chance to submit their projects into the MACS STEM MAD showcase. This year MACS were overwhelmed with over 220 entries. They tried to accept at least one group in each school that applied.

We were awarded with 3 group entries at the STEM showcase at the Catholic Leadership Centre on Thursday 12th October. I was particularly impressed by the maturity and confidence in which all our students presented their STEM Project. The standard of work was excellent and a credit to all the students. Thank you also to the hardworking STEM teaching team. We thank Shania Murray, Aleesia Trimboli, Erin Whitbread and Melissa Gatt for the teaching guidance they have given to their students.

A very big congratulations to our RETIRE TIME APP who was named in the top 3 Finalist for the showcase. This is an outstanding achievement given the standard of the entries on the day.

Here is a recount from the winning Retire Time App group, sharing their reflections of the showcase: We left St Peters at 7:50am and took the train to North Richmond. When we arrived at MACS, there was a brief introductory speech. We also had the chance to view other school's creations. After that, we practised our project speech. Our project is an app for elderly and retired people, which is mainly aimed at people at risk with Dementia or Alzheimer's disease, because we included games and other things to help stimulate their brains. When the judges came around we were very nervous but we spoke with confidence and showed our prototype, our coding and demonstrated the current version of our app. We then roamed around exploring and looking at all the cool activities, such as flying the drones, a scavenger hunt, a gelati stand and a photo booth. After exploring MACS, we got the opportunity to be on the radio and soon it will be a podcast! During the interview, we had to answer some questions about our creation. Then, we went to go to the award ceremony, and we are very proud to announce that we came in the top three out of the primary school division in Victoria! We were overjoyed. Once we got back to school, we told everyone the good news. Thank you so much to our teachers for helping us get to where we are today. Our next stop is Nationals! Thank you to MACS for helping us make some amazing new memories!

Year 6 Virtual Puberty Information Evening

On Tuesday 31st October at 7pm our school will be hosting a puberty parent night. The session will be held **via Zoom.** This session is for Year 6 students only. A parent or carer must be present throughout the session. We strongly encourage all Year 6 families to attend this event. Please reply to the Operoo note sent last week.

This parent night will be facilitated by a qualified Family Life Educator using the program Things Are Changing, which is an endorsed resource by the Bishop and Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS). The event will run for 60 minutes and will cover various topics, including:

- Hormones and the time of intense growth that occurs during puberty.
- General changes that happen during puberty, such as hair growth, body odour, body shape, and perspiration.
- The male and female reproductive systems.
- The female cycle of fertility and menstruation.
- Emotional changes that occur.

Please note that while this session will cover many important aspects of puberty, conception and sexual intercourse will not be discussed.

Year 6 Water Safety Program

Over the past two weeks our students participated in a water safety program at the Epping Leisure Centre.

The aim of school-run swimming, water safety and lifesaving programs will enable children to learn core survival swimming skills as a minimum, preparing them for unexpected entry into (open) water; learn personal safety when it comes to assisting someone in trouble; learn a valuable skill for life; increase their self awareness around water. Outstanding School Fees

Thank you very much to the families that have paid the 2023 school fees and the families that are making regular payments. Your payments ensure we can continue to provide the outstanding facilities and opportunities to engage and grow our students.

This year we have provided one to one laptops for every student in Years 2 - 6. The Year 1, 2 and 6 students have participated in a water safety program at the Epping YMCA. Year 3/4 students have participated in the gymnastics program at the YMCA. We have provided small class sizes and exceptional specialist classes to improve engagement that stretches and challenges our students every day. We have dedicated spaces and genuine intervention and extension programs.







We do however have a large number of families that have not contributed to school fees in 2023. It is an expectation of enrolment that school fees are paid on time or a payment plan is established collaboratively with the school Principal. I will continue to make contact with these families that have outstanding fees and work to get full payment or set up a payment plan option. 

Year 1 Scienceworks visit

Recently, the Year One students were taken on an adventure to the Scienceworks Museum. This excursion was to support and celebrate our Inquiry unit in Term 3 - Let's Move It!. The students have been inquiring into push, pull, gravity, magnetism and friction forces. As a cohort we investigated how these forces are used throughout our everyday lives and made connections between these forces and toys they may play with.

At Scienceworks the students were fortunate enough to participate in a Toys and Forces show. This allowed them to apply their knowledge and understanding of forces to the range of different toys Scienceworks exposed them to. After wandering through the many exhibits on offer at Scienceworks, the students also had the opportunity to explore Beyond Perceptions. This exhibit immersed the students in the imperceptible world of science and technology as they revealed the invisible fields and forces that surround us such as; gravitational waves, invisible light, sound and aerodynamics.

It was a memorable day that was enjoyed by all! The Year One teachers were extremely proud of the students and their impeccable behaviour and respect they demonstrated towards Scienceworks Museum.

MACS and MONASH Problem Based Learning Research Project

As some of you may already be aware due to previous announcements, we have been involved in a Problem Based Learning research project in partnership with MACS and MONASH university. Our particular research question has specifically been focusing on whether or not explicit teaching of critical and creative thinking skills within STEM can actually help to support our learners. Part of our contribution has been the implementation of the Learning Assets that connect well within the critical and creative thinking capability.

Collaboration, Communication, Thinking, Researching and Self-Managing.

As the research project is coming to its 3 year completion, a filming crew from Monash visited us today to capture some of our illustrations of practice. This has been a very exciting opportunity for St. Peter's as our story and school improvement in the area of STEM will become an exemplary case study across Australia and internationally for other educators to learn from our model.
















Do you love music?



Procedure for Reporting an Absence

Thank you to the families that are using the notices@stprepp.catholic.edu.au email account or the 'Report an Absence' link on our website, to notify the school of an absence.

We have a number of families travelling overseas during Term 4 2023 and Term 1 2024. The exemption from school form must be completed for students that are absent for more than 10 consecutive school days.

Medical Management

Asthma & Hayfever

We are seeing an increase of students with asthma and hayfever symptoms. Having good control of hayfever can help to reduce asthma triggers. If your child has allergies such as hay fever and asthma and require medication at school, a personal ASCIA Action Plan needs to be completed in colour, signed by the doctor and a copy provided to the school office. It is recommended that all plans are reviewed on an annual basis. If your child hasn't had their plan reviewed in the past year, now is the time to do this.

The <u>Green Allergy / Allergic Rhinitis Action Plan</u> is to be used for students with allergic rhinitis (hay fever) that may require treatment such as antihistamines. The <u>Asthma Action Plan for Victorian Schools</u> is to be used for students who have asthma.

Any prescribed medication associated with the plan needs to be supplied to the school in its original packaging. In accordance with our <u>Medical Management Policy</u>, medications such as paracetamol and ibuprofen can only be administered at school with a medical authority form completed by the parent and medical practitioner. Medication is not to be kept with students in their bags. It is preferable that medication is administered at home where possible.

Other Medical Conditions

If your child has a diagnosed medical condition, a **specific condition form** (i.e. Anaphylaxis, Diabetes, Asthma, Epilepsy, Hayfever) or a generic **Medical Management Plan** for all other medical conditions needs to be completed by your child's doctor and provided to the school. This will enable the school to ensure we are meeting our duty of care obligations and to develop a **Student Health Support plan**.

A **Student Health Support Plan** is a document that the School and Parent create and agree upon based on the information provided in the Medical Management Plan. This document details how staff will provide the required support, where medication will be stored, what will happen on excursions etc.
