

Parking

Please be mindful of the parking restrictions in Coulstock and Wedge Street. There are parking time limits of 3 minutes and no standing zones. Parking officers frequently pass the school and take photos of parking violations and fines are sent in the mail.

Please abide by time limits to avoid a fine. It will also enable a greater number of families to access the bays at drop off and pick up.

Coulstock Street

Parking bays are available for families. Please note that on the opposite side of the road no parking signs have been erected. When cars park on the opposite side of the road it makes it difficult for cars to reverse out of the bays.

Crossing the road

Please make use of the supervised crossing. It is dangerous for our students to cross the road opposite the school Coulstock gate and the 3 minute parking bays. Cars are moving in and out of bays and also travelling along Coulstock Street.

Wedge Street

Kiss and drop on Wedge Street is a quick and easy drop off for families on the move.

- 1. Bags must be in the cabin of the car at entry and exit. Children are not to get bags out of the boot of the car. We do not want children standing between cars in case a car accidentally accelerates.
- 2. Children must exit from the passenger side of the car to prevent walking between cars.
- 3.Drivers must drive along to the end bay to ensure the maximum number of cars can enter the kiss and drop zone.

Parking restrictions apply in this zone.

Oval Project

An update on the progress of the Oval Project and inform you about the next steps in the development process.

Currently, our team is in the final stages of reviewing the drainage plan for the project site. Ensuring that adequate drainage is in place is critical to the success of the project and the long-term sustainability of the oval. Unfortunately our school has a history of flooding.

This is the key area we are focusing on at the moment, and it has become the primary factor affecting the timeline.

We have project meetings scheduled for tomorrow and Monday to discuss the status of the works and to determine how we can move forward.

During these meetings, we aim to finalize the drainage plans and address any outstanding concerns. We will keep you informed of any important developments and provide a timeline once we have clarity on the situation.

We understand how much this project means to the community, and we are committed to making sure it is completed with the utmost care and attention to detail. Thank you for your continued support and patience as we work to bring the Oval Project to life.

Religious Education

Our 2025 school theme at St. Peter's is, "We are Pilgrims of Hope," which is taken directly from Pope Francis' motto for the Ordinary Jubilee Year of 2025. The Holy Year of Jubilee is recognised and celebrated by Catholics worldwide, and occurs every twenty-five years. It is a time to re-establish our personal relationship with God, with one another, and with all of creation.

During this Holy Year Pope Francis *calls us to be tangible signs of hope in our world*; specifically for those vulnerable in our society including the sick, elderly, migrant, poor and the young. The staff at St. Peter's commenced 2025 reflecting on what this specific call means for us as educators as we accompany our students on their educational journey.

Throughout the year, our students will come to a deeper understanding of Christian hope which guides us through our life's pilgrimage. Themes of hope and pilgrimage will be evident in our daily life at St. Peter's, and you will see this reflected during classroom prayer times, community Masses, school celebrations and in learning spaces.

Parents, caregivers and educators all share the responsibility of modelling hope to our young people. It is important that we understand Christian hope is not wishful thinking, or the expectation that the outcome we desire will come to fruition. Rather, it is the trust we place in the Lord, that what will come, will serve us well. It is easy to have hope when things are going well, it is during the dark times in life that we are tested to hold onto the hope that the light will return.

Traditionally a pilgrimage is a journey taken on foot, in the hopes of rediscovering the value of simplicity in our lives. Through this simplicity, we find ourselves present to the presence of God in the world, and able to appreciate with gratitude the beauty that surrounds us. However, a pilgrimage can also be used to describe the symbolic journey we take in life, with God as our guide who accompanies His people to move forward "firm in faith, active in charity and steadfast in hope" (1 Thess 1:3).

As we journey through life, we experience moments that demand greater hope. It is however a journey that we never walk alone. Although we each take our individual steps in life, we all march together as a St. Peter's community; bound together in the hope we have for the future of our young people.

School Fees Information

CAMPS, SPORTS AND EXCURSION FUND (CSEF)

The Camps, Sports and Excursion Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian State Government to assist eligible families to cover the cost of school trips, camp and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means tested **CONCESSION CARD** you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is \$150.00 per primary student

We encourage all parents who have a concession card to apply for this benefit. If you would like to apply, please see the office staff for the appropriate form.

Applications for CSEF close Friday 13th June 2025. Applications after this date cannot be accepted and therefore the MACS Concessional Fee cannot be applied.

Please continue reading to understand if you are eligible for discounted school fees under the MACS 2025 School Fees Concession Program.

- Any family of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander heritage
- Any family holding a Health Care Card and eligible for CSEF
- Any family experiencing <u>severe</u> financial hardship
- · Any family holding a DVA Gold Card
- Any family identified as refugees and holding an ImmiCard

Families who meet one of the above criteria are required to fill in the following documentation, which will be available from the office:

- · Concessional Fee Application Form
- · A completed Direct Debit Request Form
- · A copy of the government concession card (if applicable)
- · A completed Camps, Sports and Excursions (CSEF) form

Parent / Grandparent Helpers in the Classroom - 2025

Overview:

Parents and grandparents play a crucial role in our school community, offering valuable support in classrooms, learning spaces, and school activities. In 2025, we are introducing an updated system for managing parent and grandparent helpers to ensure an organized and effective approach to scheduling assistance.

Key Changes for 2025

Parent Helper Workshops:

At the start of the year, all new parent and grandparent helpers will be required to attend a workshop. This workshop will provide important information on classroom expectations, safety protocols, and ways to support students effectively. Attendance is mandatory for anyone wishing to volunteer in the classroom or school activities. (it is not required if you have already completed the workshop)

Registration for Availability:

At the end of Term 1, 2025, parents and grandparents will have the opportunity to register their availability to assist in the school and various learning spaces. This registration will allow us to keep a record of when helpers are free and ensure we can reach out efficiently when help is needed.

Helper Schedule:

Once registered, each helper's details (name, available time, email, and phone number) will be entered into a central schedule. This schedule will be accessible to teachers who can refer to it when they need assistance in the classroom or with other activities, such as incursions, excursions, sporting events, and more.

Teacher Access:

Teachers will have access to the schedule and will contact parents and grandparents directly when they need help. Teachers aim to provide at least one week's notice to ensure helpers have adequate time to confirm their availability.

Opportunities for Support:

Parent and grandparent helpers may be called upon for various tasks, including:

- Assisting in classroom lessons
- Helping with school excursions and incursions
- Supporting sporting events and school activities
- Providing additional assistance during busy periods, such as assessment times or special projects.

By introducing this new scheduling system, we aim to improve communication between the school and volunteers, streamline the process of scheduling helpers, and make it easier for teachers to access the support they need. We look forward to continuing our partnership with parents and grandparents to enrich the educational experience for all students.

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
