Principal Report

This has been one of the most difficult weeks of my professional career leading the school through the grief and loss of a staff member and friend.

I first met Sara Brundell five years ago, at the beginning of my journey as Principal here at St Peter's. At the time, our school was entering a period of change — a time to rebuild and renew our vision as a vibrant place of learning, faith and connection. From the very beginning, Sara stood beside me on that journey. She held tightly to the heart of what made St Peter's special and embraced the new chapter with open arms and unwavering support.

Those who had the privilege of knowing Sara will remember her unmistakable laugh — full of joy, warmth and life. It could lift a room and brighten even the heaviest of days. But even more than that, she had an extraordinary way of caring for others. Whether it was a quiet "You got this?" in passing or a gentle "Are you okay?" During a tough moment, Sara always made time to check in. She genuinely listened without judgement and offered support when needed.

Sara never sought recognition. She simply showed up — every day, with love, dedication, and quiet strength. Whether she was greeting students in the morning or ensuring their safety in the afternoon, Sara's presence was constant and comforting. She assisted students that had friendship problems or was that comforting ear when a child was overwhelmed and needed time to compose. She poured her heart into ensuring that our students' social and emotional wellbeing came first.

Sara was an amazing and generous soul who led with passion, integrity and deep faith. She believed wholeheartedly in this community and gave herself to it with love and dedication. Her impact will be felt for many years to come and her spirit will always remain a part of St Peter's.

Sara will be deeply missed by all the students and staff who had the privilege of knowing her. Personally, I will miss our catch-up chats — the gentle reassurances, the quiet strength she offered and the way she always made space for others, no matter how busy the day.

Our thoughts and prayers are with her husband Mick, her sons Nathan and Lachlan, and their extended family as they begin to navigate life without her.

We hold them close in our hearts and pray for comfort, strength and peace in the days ahead. May they feel the love and support of the St Peter's community surrounding them, just as Sara so often surrounded others with her care and kindness.

After Sara's funeral we will share with the school community a memorial plan we have to honour Sara's legacy and ensure her spirit lives on in our school.

I've received a few enquiries regarding whether children should attend Sara's funeral. I want to acknowledge how difficult this time is for our whole community and thank you for your ongoing care and sensitivity.

Attendance at the funeral is ultimately a family decision and we respect and support whatever choice you feel is best for your child.

At the recent Mass dedicated to Sara, we observed that some children became quite upset, which is entirely understandable given the emotional weight of the occasion. With this in mind, I encourage families to consider what will be most supportive for their child's wellbeing.

Please know that the funeral will be live-streamed and we will also provide the option for children accompanied by families to watch the service in the Galilee space rather than attending inside the church, if you feel that may be a more suitable option.

Please note on this day families are responsible for the supervision of children.

The casket may be confronting for the children.

Communion will be offered in the Galilee space by special ministers.



Funeral streaming link will be shared when it becomes available.

Sincere thanks to the families who have so kindly offered to donate a morning tea plate for mourners to share after the funeral and to those who are assisting with serving tea and coffee.

Your generosity, compassion and willingness to help during this time are deeply appreciated. Thank you once again for the care and support you continue to show as we navigate this difficult time together.

Do you have a primary school-aged child experiencing symptoms of anxiety?

Clinicians at Swinburne University have developed a program to help parents manage childhood anxiety in children aged 6-11 years.

Does your child experience any of the following?

- Difficulties sleeping at night due to worries
- · Fears and phobias
- Difficulty separating from you or worrying about parental safety
- Trouble sleeping alone in their bed
- · Fear of the dark
- Scared of lifts, trains, and people
- · Fear of dogs and other animals
- Excessive worry and constant reassurance seeking
- Fear of germs and other health problems

The One Step at a Time Program involves:

- Comprehensive psychological assessment of your child's anxiety
- Seven sessions of online counselling through video conferencing
- Parent-focused cognitive behavioral therapy (CBT) skills to help you manage and support your child's anxiety
- Two combined parent-child sessions
- · Reflective parenting strategies
- Access to a website with selfhelp materials to supplement therapy.

Cost

\$20 per session/assessment. Treatment consists of seven therapy sessions plus one assessment session.
