# **Religious Education**


### Ash Wednesday and Lent



Next Wednesday, February 14th, is Ash Wednesday. Year 5/6 students will be attending parish mass and all other year levels will be participating in a class liturgy on this day.

Ash Wednesday, is a significant day in the lives of Catholics as well as in the liturgical calendar. Ash Wednesday is the first day of the season of Lent. On Ash Wednesday and throughout Lent, we are called into a time of deep reflection and personal growth.

God calls us to use the time of Lent to cleanse ourselves from sin and to be the best people we can be. In Lent we take active steps to place God at the centre of our lives. When God is at the centre of all we are and all we do, we are living in the light of Christ.

# **Learning and Teaching**

It's been a busy start to the beginning of a new school year. Teachers and students have spent the last week and this week getting to know each other by undergoing literacy and numeracy assessments as well as implementing Social and Emotional Wellbeing lessons to develop positive and respectful relationships.

New beginnings allow us to start fresh.

All year levels across the school will be inquiring into a central theme of Belonging and Living in Harmony with one another. Our main message within this humanities inquiry will be to explain that every member of a group has the responsibility to cooperate with and show respect for other group members, especially as a student of St. Peter's school and the wider community.

We aim to enact our school vision as an inclusive, diverse and faith filled community, where we aim to be life long, happy, healthy and harmonious learners.



It has been absolutely delightful seeing our students already positively engaging in their new classroom learning spaces with their new teachers for 2024, ready for what we strive to be a year focused on our students as effective learners!

#### 2024 Term 1 Faith/Life/World Units of Inquiry

Our Term 1 overarching humanities big idea centres around the theme of Belonging and Harmony. Students will be invited to discuss and learn about what inclusivity means and how Jesus teaches us to 'Love one another.' We have a diverse cultural background here at St. Peter's, and so our students will engage in learning that will help them identify the different cultural, religious and/or social groups to which they and others in the community may belong. Term 1 will also include inquiry into how people participate in their community as active, respectful citizens. We hope that our students will come to understand that we all have a part to play in accepting a



person's identity to achieve a sense of belonging, as one! At the end of the term, we will celebrate Harmony Day with a Colour Run event (more information to follow).



# Home Learning



At St. Peter's, we recognise that learning is a lifelong process and believe that a learning partnership between the home and school is at the heart of it.

Home Learning (traditionally referred to as Homework) is purposeful learning that occurs outside of the classroom which is set by the classroom teacher. It benefits students by complementing classroom learning and providing opportunities for students to be responsible for


their own learning, deepening their understanding and skills. Home Learning, therefore, should not be seen as 'work' rather than supportive learning that can be done at home with an ease of success, to consolidate the learning that has occurred at school.

Annual school photos including sibling photos will be taken by Arthur Reed Photos on Tuesday 5th


March 2024. There is no need to return any forms or money to school. Unique image codes will be issued to all students on/after photo day so families can register online to view images when they become available in the webshop.

#### **Existing Families with children starting Prep in 2025**

If your child turns 5 before 31st April 2025 they are eligible to enrol for Prep commencing 2025.

If you have not yet completed an enrolment form for your child, please do so at your earliest convenience and return the form to the school office so that your child can be allocated a place for Prep 2025. In 2025 we will have 2 prep classes. Families with siblings that have completed and handed in an enrolment form for their child will be prioritised. Remaining places will be offered to other families outside of the school until all places have been filled. Please note we can only allocate a place for your child if we know you are intending to send them to school. If we do not receive an enrolment form for your child in line with our enrolment timeline and all places have been filled, we may not be able to accommodate your child. We therefore strongly encourage you to contact the office and complete the enrolment application.

## Procedure for Reporting an Absence

Thank you to the families that are using the <a href="mailto:notices@stprepp.catholic.edu.au">notices@stprepp.catholic.edu.au</a> email account or the 'Report an Absence' link on our website, to notify the school of an absence.

It is not alway possible for teachers to access emails before they mark the morning roll or they may also be absent. By sending an email to the notices email address, the office staff can make sure the roll is updated. Please send an email for each day your child is absent, or specify a date range for their absence. A reason for the absence must be noted.

The exemption from school form is to be completed for students that are absent for more than 10 school days. The form is also available from the school office.
