The timeline of events and dates is as follows:

- Applications for students starting Year 7 in 2027 will open on Tuesday 28 January 2025 and close on Friday 15 August 2025.
- Offers will be communicated to prospective Year 7 applicants on Friday 17 October 2025.
- Parents/carers will be required to accept an offer from a school by Friday 7 November 2025.
- Parents/carers are encouraged to make two applications to colleges to ensure all students are offered a place


## Wellbeing

## **Medical Management**

With the onset of Spring and the warmer weather, it is a good time to review your child's Hay fever and Asthma plans. If your child has allergies which may require management at school, a personal ASCIA Action Plan needs to be completed in colour, completed and signed by the doctor and a copy provided to the school office.

The <u>Green Allergy / Allergic Rhinitis Action Plan</u> is to be used for students with allergic rhinitis (hay fever) that may require treatment such as antihistamines.

The <u>Asthma Action Plan for Victorian Schools</u> is to be used for students who have asthma.

St Peter's Primary School has a duty of care to support access to education through the management of health care needs diagnosed by a medical practitioner.

Parents/guardians/carers must inform St Peter's school office of any diagnosed health care need or medical condition when a student is enrolled at the school.

Our <u>Administration of Medication Policy</u> outlines our procedures if medication is required to be administered at school.



St Peter's provides students with access to sunscreen in their learning space. The sunscreen we use is Woolworths Sunscreen 50+ every day lotion.



The active ingredients are: Homosalate 100 mg/g, Octyl Salicylate 50 mg/g, Butyl Methoxybenzoylmethane 30 mg/g, Octocrylene 80 mg/g

If your child has skin sensitivities and is unable to use this sunscreen, we ask that you send your child to school with their own and advise the teacher they should not use the school provided sunscreen.


The Fear Less Group runs over 6 x 1.5-hour sessions. Attendance to all sessions is required.

## Reporting your child's absence
