War memorial garden

Catholic Education Week will be celebrated in Catholic schools in the Archdiocese of Melbourne from 10–17 March 2024.

This annual event is held to promote the special ethos of Catholic schools and to highlight the great things that take place in Catholic schools every day.

The theme for this year's celebrations is 'In the Light of Christ'.

Catholic education strives to make a difference in the lives of those in our schools and in the wider community by challenging young people to live out the message of Jesus and walk the way of the gospel to reach their full potential as compassionate, contributing, life-giving members of society.

There are 331 Catholic schools in the Archdiocese of Melbourne that educate around 114,000 students and employ more than 16,000 teachers and staff, and most will celebrate Catholic Education Week in some way.

Next week all students at St Peter's will participate in learning centered around Catholic Education week and the theme 'In the Light of Christ'.

Our year 6 Faith Leaders, School Captains and Vice Captains will attend mass at St Patrick's Cathedral to celebrate Catholic Education Week and the feast of St Patrick. They will then take part in some activities with other Catholic schools from across Melbourne.

We also have a number of students who have had their artwork chosen to be displayed at the Creative Arts Exhibition, exhibiting artworks from students in Catholic Schools from the Archdiocese.

Resilience Rights and Respectful Relationships

The Resilience Rights and Respectful Relationships (RRRR) curriculum promotes respect, positive attitudes and behaviors and provides regular practice for the development of students' social, emotional and positive relationship skills. These attitudes and behviours teaches our students how to build healthy relationships, resilience and confidence, contributing to a calm, positive learning environment.



Emotional Literacy refers to a person's ability to recognise, name and express feelings. Each class has been covering curriculum content in Topic 1: Emotional Literacy This helps students develop the ability to be aware of, understand and use vocabulary about the emotional states of themselves and others.

Supporting re-telling skills - The benefits of talking about your day

Talking with children is important because it builds their language and communication skills. By creating opportunities for your child to retell stories you can boost your child's understanding of how stories work. This is a great way to build their listening comprehension (listening and understanding), early literacy, vocabulary and help them to put sentences together correctly and use correct grammar. Research shows that supporting the re-telling of personal experiences is an important tool in language development (Saunders & Goldenberg, 1999).

When you go on an outing with your child take a few photos of what's happening around you. For example, during a trip to the farm, take photos as your child feeds the animals, goes on a ride, or eats lunch. Later, look at the photos together and use them to help guide your child to retell what happened at the farm. By placing the pictures in an order, like a story, you can teach your child about the sequence of events and words they can use to help them retell stories, such as the words 'first', 'next', and 'last'. This activity can also help your child to use joining words in their sentences like 'and' and 'because' and use specific vocabulary related to the event. You could create your own personalised book in this similar manner, which is another idea to support your child's language development at home in a fun and personal way.

Each day when you get home, ask your child, "How was your day?". Help them get started by giving them some ideas and sentence starters such as: <u>"Today at school I learned..."</u>, <u>"At recess I</u> ...", <u>"For lunch I ate..."</u>, "My favourite thing about today was...."

Do the same task by re-tellig your own day so your child hears a model. This routine not only helps your child get better at talking, listening, and understanding, but also creates a nice way for both of you to share your day.

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Medical Management

Asthma & Hayfever

Having good control of hayfever can help to reduce asthma triggers. If your child has allergies such as hay fever and asthma and require medication at school, a personal ASCIA Action Plan needs to be completed in colour, signed by the doctor and a copy provided to the school office. It is recommended that all plans are reviewed on an annual basis. If your child hasn't had their plan reviewed this year, now is the time to do this.

The <u>Green Allergy / Allergic Rhinitis Action Plan</u> is to be used for students with allergic rhinitis (hay fever) that may require treatment such as antihistamines.

The Asthma Action Plan for Victorian Schools is to be used for students who have asthma.

Any prescribed medication associated with the plan needs to be supplied to the school in its original packaging. In accordance with our<u>Medical Management Policy</u>, medications such as paracetamol and ibuprofen can only be administered at school with a medical authority form completed by the parent and medical practitioner. Medication is not to be kept with students in their bags. It is preferable that medication is administered at home where possible.

Other Medical Conditions

If your child has a diagnosed medical condition, a **specific condition form** (i.e: Anaphylaxis, Diabetes, Asthma, Epilepsy, Hayfever) or a generic **Medical Management Plan** for all other medical conditions needs to be completed by your child's doctor and provided to the school. This will enable the school to ensure we are meeting our duty of care obligations and to develop a **Student Health Support plan**.

A **Student Health Support Plan** is a document that the School and Parent create and agree upon based on the information provided in the Medical Management Plan. This document details how staff will provide the required support, where medication will be stored, what will happen on excursions etc.

If you are unsure whether your child needs a Medical Management Plan at school, please contact the school office on 94011157 / <u>office@stprepp.catholic.edu.au</u> for further information and guidance. The care, safety and wellbeing of our students is of utmost importance.



Existing Families with children starting Prep in 2025

If your child turns 5 before 31st April 2025 they are eligible to enrol for Prep commencing 2025.

If you have not yet completed an enrolment form for your child, please do so at your earliest convenience and return the form to the school office so that your child can be allocated a place for Prep 2025. In 2025 we will have 2 prep classes. Families with siblings that have completed and handed in an enrolment form for their child will be prioritised. Remaining places will be offered to other families outside of the school until all places have been filled. Please note we can only allocate a place for your child if we know you are intending to send them to school. If we do not receive an enrolment form for your child in line with our enrolment timeline and all places have been filled, we may not be able to accommodate your child. We therefore strongly encourage you to contact the office and complete the enrolment application.

Procedure for Reporting an Absence

Thank you to the families that are using the notices@stprepp.catholic.edu.au email account or the 'Report an Absence' link on our website, to notify the school of an absence.

It is not alway possible for teachers to access emails before they mark the morning roll or they may also be absent. By sending an email to the notices email address, the office staff can make sure the roll is updated. Please send an email for each day your child is absent, or specify a date range for their absence. A reason for the absence must be noted. The exemption from school form is to be completed for students that are absent for more than 10 school days. The form is also available from the school office.
